The Executive Committee will review nominations and select, at their discretion, worthy recipients. The Executive Committee reserves the right to accept or deny any awards in any or all of the categories.

ALTON THOMAS AWARD

PGASLA's highest honor and only given to a member, affiliate, outstanding citizen or community leader who has performed in a manner above and beyond what would be considered normal with the result of this effort either directly promoting or enhancing the image of landscape architecture.

NOMINEE _____

KESSLER LEGACY AWARD

This PGASLA Landscape Legacy Award recognizes those works of Landscape Architecture that have endured in the Prairie Gateway region and are a viable component of our regional landscape heritage. The works must be located within the Prairie Gateway boundary, must be constructed and/or completed at least twenty years ago and must remain as viable today as they were when originally completed. Originally called the Landscape Legacy Award, the name was changed to the Kessler Legacy Award to honor George Kessler who first helped promote the City Beautiful movement in Kansas City.

METROGREEN VISIONARY AWARD

In association with the 1991 ASLA National Annual Meeting, held in Kansas City, the Prairie Gateway Chapter facilitated a local service project. Inspired by the Kessler Plan, the MetroGreen Plan identified a regional greenway system for the metro area linking existing parks, urban spaces and rural green spaces by proposing a system of trails and bike paths. This award celebrates the vision that the MetroGreen Plan started, but awarded to the city, county or governmental agency within the PGASLA boundary that conducts outstanding efforts to promote trails and greenways, like MetroGreen.
